

Losing a tooth isn't just an aesthetic issue; **it can compromise oral health**, causing gradual resorption of the bone and the gum tissue covering it.

Over time, this phenomenon can cause a significant change in facial features, as the tissues no longer find support in the underlying bone structures. Furthermore, adjacent teeth will tend to shift toward the empty space, causing not only aesthetic misalignment but also difficulty chewing.

WHAT ARE *DENTAL* IMPLANTS AND HOW DO THEY WORK?



Implant in actual size

An implant is a small **biocompatible titanium** screw that is inserted into the bone of the upper or lower jaw. Once the implant is inserted, it integrates with the bone itself and ensures **long-term functionality and stability**.



Natural tooth



Implant and crown

An **artificial crown** is attached to the implant, replicating the shape and function of a natural tooth. It is a safe, durable, and naturally aesthetic solution.

The procedure is performed under **local anesthesia**: it is quick and painless.

Swelling or discomfort may occur in the days following the procedure, but these can be managed with targeted treatments.

The dentist will provide appropriate instructions for a recovery without complications.

It is essential to maintain good **oral hygiene** and follow your dentist's instructions.

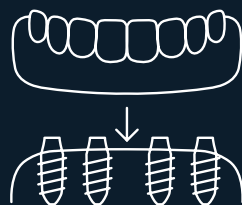

ADVANTAGES OF DENTAL IMPLANTS

You can **smile with confidence** again, speak freely, and eat everything you like. Even in cases of full dentures - affecting all teeth in the mouth - implants provide a **stable**, fixed restoration that is well-integrated with each patient's aesthetics and function.

RISKS AND PRECAUTIONS



- As with any surgical procedure, there are possible **minor** risks (such as infections).
- With the **proper care** and thorough hygiene, implants have a high success rate.
- **Regular check-ups** are essential for the long-term longevity of the implants.
- Avoid hard foods and follow your doctor's instructions for optimal healing.
- **Smoking** can compromise healing and the longevity of the treatment: discuss this with your doctor.

COSTS

The cost of implant surgery **varies depending on the clinical complexity** and the type of prosthesis. Each treatment is determined together with your dentist, based on your specific needs and conditions.

FAQ



➤ **How painful is the implant surgery?**

The procedure is performed under local anesthesia, so you won't feel any pain during the procedure. After the procedure, you may experience mild discomfort, which can be managed with common pain relievers.

➤ **How long does a dental implant last?**

A dental implant can last up to 15–20 years*. Its lifespan depends on factors such as oral hygiene, regular check-ups, and healthy lifestyle habits.

➤ **Will I be able to eat everything after getting a dental implant?**

In the first few days after the procedure, it's important to stick to a soft diet. Once the implant has healed, you can return to eating normally.

➤ **Will I be able to speak normally after the procedure?**

Yes, in most cases you'll be able to speak normally just a few hours after the procedure. You may experience some mild initial difficulty, but this is temporary and tends to resolve quickly.

➤ **Can I play sports or engage in physical activity after the procedure?**

It is advisable to avoid intense sports or strenuous physical activity for at least 3–5 days after the procedure. Once the initial healing phase is over, you can gradually return to your normal exercise routine.
